

Privacy Policy



Overview

Saints Prison Ministry (alternately, “Saints”, “we”, “us”, or “our”) respects your privacy and is committed to complying with this privacy policy (“Privacy Policy”), which describes what information we collect about you, including how we collect it, how we use it, with whom we may share it and what choices you have regarding our use of your information. This Privacy Policy applies to information collected on our website located at <https://www.saintsprisonministry.org/> (the “Website”), all interactive features, applications, widgets, social network pages, emails, and other online or wireless offerings that post a link to this Privacy Policy, as well as to information that we collect in the course of our operations such as fundraising or ministry work.

Changes to our Privacy Policy

We may change this Privacy Policy at any time and from time to time. The most recent version of the Privacy Policy is reflected by the version date located at the bottom of this Privacy Policy.

What Information Do We Collect and How Do We Use It?

Donors and Volunteers

We collect and use personal information and payments from donors when a donor or volunteer provides it to us. In addition, we collect gift and payment information from donors – including credit card information – and keep a record of each donor’s giving history. This information is kept on file for IRS purposes and is also used in our internal development processes. Saints will use contact information of donors for purposes including, without limitation:

- to distribute gift acknowledgements and receipts for donations;
- to thank donors for their gifts;
- organize and deliver sporting events and ministry services
- to inform donors and volunteers about news, giving opportunities, and other activities of Saints;
- to engage in internal analysis and record keeping as is required by law, such as to comply with a subpoena or similar legal process; and
- when we believe, in good faith, that disclosure is necessary to protect our rights or property, investigate fraud, or respond to a government request.

Website Visitors

You may provide us with personal information when you interact with the Website. For example, when you contact us by email or by using a web form, you may provide us with personal information including but not limited to: name, home or other physical address, email address, telephone number, credit card information, and any other information you choose to provide.

We also collect information regarding how you interact with the Website, which may include pages you view, links you click or hover over, selections you make on the Website, your web browser's HTTP referrer header, features you use, preferences you set, your web browser type and version, the operating system type and version of the device you are using to access the Website, the Internet protocol (IP) address of the device you are using to access the Website (or any portion thereof), general physical location, and internet service provider address.

We may also use certain tracking technologies on the system including, without limitation, cookies. These technologies are used to passively track information about your computer and Internet connection. We may use this information for purposes of administering, protecting and improving the Website, to better understand the preferences of visitors to the Website, to identify server problems, to compile aggregated statistics about Website usage, and to help personalize your experience on our Website. You can refuse cookies by turning them off on your browser.

In addition to uses described elsewhere in this Privacy Policy, we may use the information collected about website visitors to:

- Improve the content on the Website;
- Communicate with you and respond to your inquiries, requests or orders;
- Perform data analytics;
- Send you information you request from us and promotional materials regarding our projects and events; and
- Improve our marketing strategies.

How and With Whom Do We Share Information That We Collect?

Except as set forth in this Privacy Policy, Saints will not transfer your information unless:

- 1) you expressly authorize Saints to do so,
- 2) it is necessary to allow Saints' service providers, agents, or other third parties to provide products or services for or to Saints,
- 3) it is necessary in order to provide our ministry,
- 4) SPM is sending you other information that may be useful to you,
- 5) it is necessary to protect the confidentiality or security of your records,
- 6) it is necessary in connection with other purposes including, without limitation, verifying identity, age, and/or payment details, investigating complaints about the risk assessment, security, fraud and crime prevention/detection, monitoring, research and analysis, marketing, customer purchasing preferences and trends and dispute resolution,
- 7) it is necessary or helpful for responding to law enforcement, governmental mandate, or other legal requirement, if appropriate, for your protection or in connection with an investigation or prosecution of possible unlawful activity;
- 8) subject to applicable contractual or legal restrictions, it is necessary in connection with a merger of Saints into another entity; or
- 9) it is otherwise necessary for Saints to disclose it as required or permitted by law.

For any donations that you make, it may be necessary for us to share some of your information with third party payment processors in order to process your requested transaction.

We do not sell, rent, or lease our user lists or the identity of individual users to third parties. We may also disclose information if we become subject to a subpoena or court order, or if we are otherwise legally required to disclose information. We may also use and disclose information to establish or exercise our legal rights, to enforce the Terms of Use, to assert and defend against legal claims, or if we believe such disclosure is necessary to investigate, prevent, or take other action regarding actual or suspected illegal or fraudulent activities or potential threats to the physical safety or well-being of any person.

Correspondence

If you correspond with Saints, the information may include the content of, and metadata regarding, any correspondence you may have with us. We may share your messages with those within our organization who are most capable of addressing the issues contained in your message. We may archive your message for a certain period of time or discard it.

We may send you emails with promotional offers only if you opt-in to receiving such emails. Job Applicants

Any personal information you provide us when applying for a career position with Saints will be used solely to consider and act upon your application. We may retain your personal information for a period of time, but only for as long as necessary for such purposes.

How Do We Protect Information Collected About You?

Saints takes commercially reasonable measures to secure and protect information. Nevertheless, no security system is impenetrable. We cannot guarantee that information that users may happen to transmit or otherwise supply will be totally secure. You agree to immediately notify us of any breach of System's security, this Privacy Policy, or the Terms of Use of which you become aware.

Linked Websites

For your convenience, some hyperlinks may be posted that link to other websites not under our control. We are not responsible for, and this Privacy Policy does not apply to, the privacy practices of those sites or of any companies that we do not own or control. We cannot be responsible for the privacy practices of any such websites or pages not under our control and we do not endorse any of these websites or pages, the services or products described or offered on such sites or pages, or any of the content contained on those sites or pages.

User-Provided Content

Any information that you submit to the Website or any mobile application by e-mail, posting, messaging, uploading, downloading, or otherwise (collectively, a “Submission”) is done at your own risk. We cannot control the actions of other users and we are therefore not responsible for any Submissions contained on the Website or other platform that we control.

Social Media Platforms and Websites

Any Submission that you submit to any of our pages contained on a social media platform or website by e-mail, posting, messaging, uploading, downloading, or otherwise is done at your own risk and without any expectation of privacy. We cannot control the actions of other users of a social media platform and we are therefore not responsible for any Submissions contained on a social media platform or website.

Children

Our program is intended for a general audience and is not intended for use or view by children under 13 years of age without parental consent, and we do not knowingly collect information about children under 13 and we do not sell products to children. Consistent with the Children's Online Privacy Protection Act, we will not knowingly collect any information from children under the age of 13 unless we have parental consent. For children under the age of 13 to participate in a trip or activity, such child's parent or guardian must provide the information necessary for that child to participate in such trip or activity.

Sending Information From Outside The United States

If we obtain your information from outside of the United States of America, please be aware that your information may be transferred to, stored or processed in the United States, where our servers are located and our central database is operated. The data protection and other laws of the United States and other countries might not be as comprehensive as those in your country, but please be assured that we take steps to protect your privacy.

Do Not Track Requests

State laws require that we indicate whether we honor "Do Not Track" settings in your browser concerning targeted advertising. "Do Not Track" is a standard that is currently under development. As it is not yet finalized, we adhere to the standards set out in this Privacy Policy and do not monitor or follow any Do Not Track browser requests.
